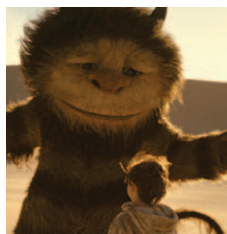

Where the Wild Things Are

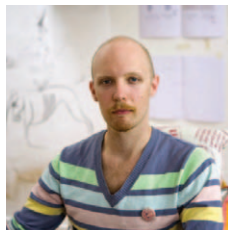

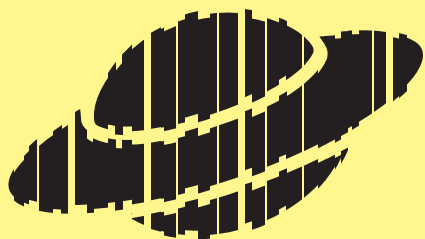
