

CAR PARKING AT HALLÉ ST PETER'S

There are several car parking options close to Hallé St Peter's: please note the following non-exhaustive list is provided as a guide only and it will be necessary to double-check the regulations on arrival at your chosen location:

- On-street parking around Ancoats is currently £1.20 for 2 hours maximum, and is free after 6pm until 8am the following morning.
- Hood Street / Jersey Street / Cotton Street corner: Comet car park: this is a manned surface car park just next to St Peter's. It costs £3.50 per day operating from 7am to 6pm each day.
- BPP car park, Jersey Street: £2.50 per day or £1.50 after 1pm. NB: open 7am-7pm only.
- Flint Glass Wharf underground car park, Jersey Street: this is a secure 24-hour underground car park, which takes card payments only. There is a price structure per time parked, for example, 3 hours costs £3; 7 hours costs £5.
- Oldham Road SiP car park: this is a 24-hour surface pay and display car park which has a price structure per time parked, for example, 2 hours costs £2; 12 hours costs £4.
- Thompson Street car park (opposite the Wing Yip on Oldham Road): this is a 24-hour surface car park which is manned and costs £3.50 per day Monday-Friday and £2 all day Saturday.
- SiP run a number of small surface pay and display car parks just across Great Ancoats Street along Newton Street and Port Street. These are generally 24-hour car parks with a price structure, for example, 2 hours costs £2; 12 hours costs £6. NB: the larger Port Street car park run by Town Centre Car Parks currently closes at 3pm.
- The nearest NCP car parks are towards the city centre, on Tib Street (surface, 24-hours) and Church Street (multi-storey, 6am-10pm). These have a price structure per time parked, for example, 2 hours costs £4; 6-24 hours costs £15.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

- Hallé St Peter's is approximately 15 minutes walk from both Victoria and Manchester Piccadilly Railway Stations.
- New Islington Metrolink Station is now open (Droylsden line). There is a short direct walk to Hallé St Peter's via the new Ancoats Jubilee Bridge and Murray Street.
- From Piccadilly Gardens the easiest walking route is along Newton Street and straight across Great Ancoats Street, which takes approximately 10 minutes.

BICYCLES

- There are storage racks for bicycles situated adjacent to HALLÉ St Peter's, just inside the railings on Hood Street. There are also bicycle racks at Koffee Lock situated just across Cutting Room Square.
